(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Elisha D. King, all that piece, part and lot of land, situate, lyer, and being, in the City of Greenville and in the State of South Carolina, containing Sixty-one and one-half acres, more or less, in the following lands of said Greenville, and in the State of South Carolina, more or less, formerly known as the Old State Road, and is about 10½ miles from Greenville, South Heard Street, hereby conveyed, may be more accurately described as follows: Beginning at a Rock 37 ½ yards due west, on the said Run of Rock, running thence along said Rock S. 88 E. 10.73 Chain, then in east road, thence N. 76 E. 11.12 Chain to Rock 37 ½ m, by said Rock, thence N. 23 E. 3.20 Chain 10.66 ft, thence N. 45 E. 15.64 Chain to a small Rock, 37 ½ m, thence N. 55 E. 28.90 Chain to a white Oak 37 ½ ft. 6 in. thence S. 25 E. 10.37 42 Chain to the beginning of Rock 37 ½ m, the foregoing tract of land is the same that was sold and conveyed to J. J. Bennett by J. J. Bennett, by deed bearing date April 6, 1888, and duly recorded on the 10th day of said month, in the Registers Office, for the County of Greenville, and for \$10.00 at Parcage 205, by the said J. J. TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises before mentioned, unto the said Elisha D. King and to his Heirs and Assigns forever.

And do hereby bind myself my Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular, the said premises unto the said Elisha D. King and to his

Heirs and Assigns, against me and my Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
