I, Joseph Leach,

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Eleven Hundred and Forty and 70/100 Dollars, to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by George C. Johnson, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said George C. Johnson, his heirs and assigns, all that piece, parcel or tract of land in said County and State known as tract No. 1 containing fifty-six and 7/8 acres more or less on Dumbarton bridge Road beginning at a poplar tree 3x0 (dead) on Saluda River, and running thence N 8 W 14° 0' to a stone 3x0; thence N 83 E 79° to a stone 3x0 thence N 83 W 14° 8' to a stone 3x0 on the Dumbarton bridge road; thence along the said road to Dumbarton bridge; thence down the meander of Saluda River, to the beginning corner—see Plat of W. D. Garrison survey as made the 30<sup>th</sup> of October 1893 in the records of the case of J. W. McSwain et al. Plaintiff vs. Mary & Hill, defendant, Judgment roll Q 789 and being the said lot of land conveyed to me by W. D. Garrison, Master on Jan 2 1894 and recorded in R. M. O. Office Books 1813 page 100

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises before mentioned, unto the said George C. Johnson, his Heirs and Assigns forever.

And I do hereby bind myself and my Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular, the said premises unto the said George C. Johnson.

Heirs and Assigns, against me and my wife, Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
