Dollars, to us, in hand paid by and before the sealing of these presents by The Washington Savings and Loan Company, A Corporation (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said The Washington Savings and Loan Company, All that certain piece or lot of land situated, lying and being in the City of Greenville, County of Greenville, State of South Carolina on the North side of East Washington Street, and having the following Mates and Bounding to wit: Beginning at an iron pin, corner of building known as "Duncans Warehouse" on Washington Street, exactly 120 feet from Main Street, thence S. 69° E. 25 feet on Washington Street to an iron pin, thence N. 21° E. 60 feet to another pin on Alley 15 feet wide, thence with said Alley, N. 69° W. 25 feet to another pin, corner of said Duncan's Warehouse building, thence S. 21° W. 60 feet with Duncans line to beginning point on Washington Street, containing 1500 square feet more or less, and being a part of the lot conveyed to Martha A.
