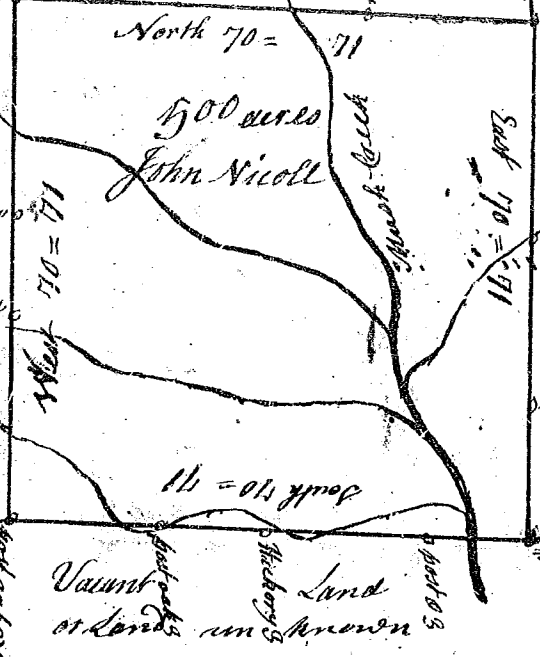
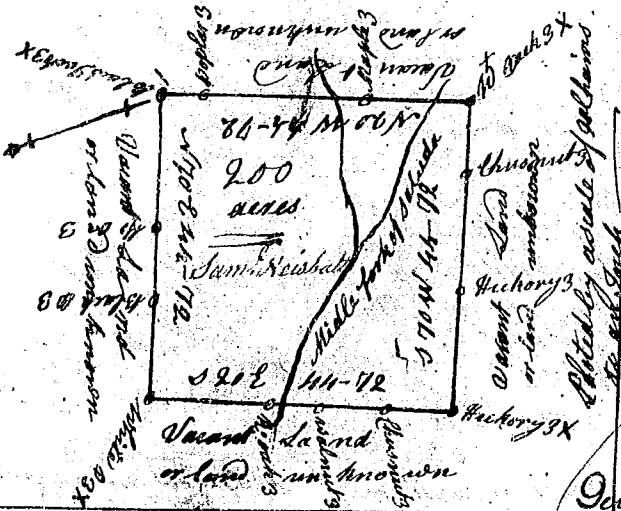

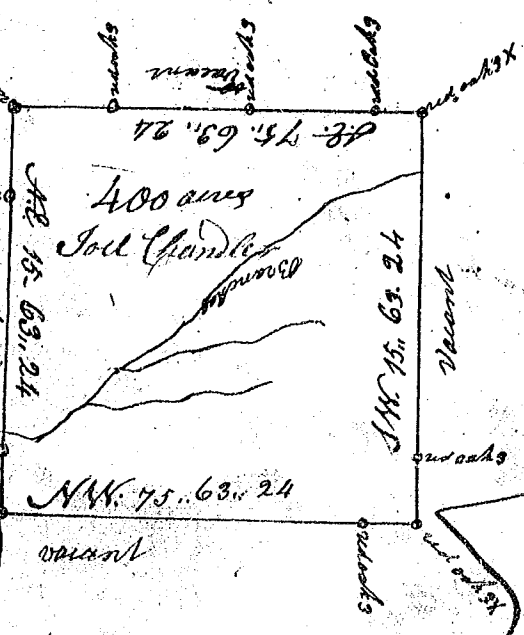


State of South Carolina,

of said Creek bounded on all
sides by vacant land. I hath
such other shapes & marks as
the above platd. represents. The
said warrant bearing date
the 21st day of May 1784 -
& executed the 9th of June
1784. and the 5th of American
Independence

Pursuant to a warrant from under the hand &
seal of John Thomas Esq. Commissioner of Location
on the North side of Saluda River, I have admeasured
& laid out unto Samuel Keasler, a plantation or
tract of land containing two hundred acres, on the
middle fork of Saluda river on both sides of said river
bounded on vacant lands or lands unknown, and
hath such shapes & marks as the above platd.
represents. B. Watery Esq. bearing date the
21st day of May 1784 I executed the 9th June 1784
