

"All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Paris Mountain Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, and known as a part of the A. M. Burdine and Caroline D. Burdine Estate, and in the subdivision of said Estate as Tract no. 6 adjoining lands of John Shockley, The Southern Powers Company, and Tract no. 5 of the aforesaid sub-division, having the following metes and bounds, to-wit; Beginning at an iron pin on the said John Shockley line and running thence S.  $71\frac{1}{2}$  <sup>20</sup>. 15.00 to an iron pin on a branch; thence S.  $7.00$  <sup>20</sup>.  $4.22$  to a pine; thence S.  $39$  <sup>20</sup>.  $392$  to a stake; thence N.  $78\frac{1}{2}$  <sup>6</sup>.  $4.50$  to a pine; thence N.  $51$  <sup>6</sup>.  $7.34$  to a swamp dogwood; thence N.  $74$  <sup>6</sup>.  $4.25$  to a stake; thence N.  $37$  <sup>6</sup>.  $3.00$  to an iron pin; thence N.  $2.75$  to the beginning corner, containing 8 and  $\frac{1}{2}$  acres, more or less."

Also, "All that other piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Paris Mountain Township, State and County aforesaid and known as a part of the above described Estate, and in the subdivision of said Estate as Tract no. —. This tract adjoins lands of Wm. Farr, Mr. Quinn and the Southern Power Company, having the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at a persimmon stump, and running thence S.  $75\frac{1}{4}$  <sup>20</sup>.  $16.38$  to a stake; thence N.  $58\frac{1}{2}$  <sup>6</sup>.  $10.55$  to a stake; thence N.  $4\frac{1}{2}$  <sup>6</sup>.  $3.15$  to a stake; thence N.  $40\frac{1}{2}$  <sup>6</sup>.  $3.71$  to a stake; thence N.  $75\frac{1}{2}$  <sup>6</sup>.  $1.21$  to a stake; thence N.  $57$  <sup>6</sup>.  $1.00$  to a stone; thence S.  $17\frac{1}{2}$  <sup>6</sup>.  $8.53$  to the beginning corner, containing 6 acres, more or less."

The above two tracts of land are the same conveyed to P. W. Burdine by C. H. Burdine, January 12, 1926, by deed recorded in Deed Book 113, at page 44, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County.

Also, "All that piece, parcel and tract of land, lying, situate, and being in Paris Mountain Township, State and County aforesaid, known as part of A. M. Burdine and Caroline D. Burdine Estate, and in subdivision as Tract no. 5, the home place, adjoining lands of John Shockley, tract no. 6 and 4. Beginning on an iron pin on a branch, thence running N.  $71\frac{1}{2}$  <sup>6</sup>.  $15.00$  to an iron pin; thence due north  $6.40$  to an iron pin, corner of tract no. 4; thence S.  $71\frac{1}{2}$  <sup>20</sup>.  $16.00$  to an iron pin on branch; thence down the branch  $6.25$  to the beginning, and containing nine acres, more or less."
