All that certain tract or parcel of land situated in Dunklin Township, Greenville County, S.C. containing 29 acres, more or less, it being the balance of a 79 acres tract of land deeded to W.E. Lothran and J.C. Lothran as Trustees for E.S. Lothran on Feb 1, 1897, by deed recorded in R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, S.C. in Book H.H.H. at Page 150 and from this original 79 acres there has been conveyed to the Belton Light + Power Co., 7.2 acres and to E.M. Lothran there has been conveyed 43 acres, and the balance of the said tract it is intended to be covered and included in this obligation.
