at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents do grant, bargain, sell
and release unto the said Peoples National Bank,

All those pieces, parcels, or lots of land, known
and designated as Lots no. 80 and 82 of a subdivision
known as Washington Heights and having according
to a plat thereof made by C. M. Furman Jr., Engineer,
February 3, 1922 and recorded in R. M. C. Office for
Greenville County in Plat Book "F", at page 54 the
following metes and bounds, courses and distances,
to-wit:

Lot no. 80. Beginning at an iron pin on the South
side of Lincoln Street at the intersection of C. & G. R.R.
right of way with said street and running thence along
the South side of said street N. 43-25-20. 52 feet to an
iron pin; thence S. 46-35-20. 100 feet to to iron pin; thence
S. 43-25-E. 36.2 feet to an iron pin to the right of way
of C. & G. R.R. Railway Co., thence along said right of
way in a northeasterly direction to the point of beginning
on Lincoln Street. Lot no. 82. Beginning at a point on the
Northern side of Lincoln Street, joint Southern corner of
lots # 81 and 82 and being 31.75 feet from the intersection
of Lincoln Street with the edge of the C. & G. R.R. right
of way; thence along the Northern side of street N. 43-25-
20. 32 feet to an iron pipe, joint corner of Lots # 82
and 83; thence N 46-35-E. 92.4 feet to an iron pipe; thence
S. 23-0-E. 35 feet to an iron pipe; thence S. 46-35-20. 80.6
feet to the beginning corner.
