in Ward 1 of the City of Greenville, being situate on the East side of Wilton Street, and more particularly described according to Plat of R. E. Dalton dated September 1942, as follows:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the East side of said Street, which iron pin is 150 feet South of the Southeast corner of West Stone Avenue and Wilton Street, and running thence with said Street S. 6-47 W. 59 feet to iron pin; thence S. 82-58 E. 96 feet to stake; thence N. 5-28 E. 55 feet to iron pin in line of lot formerly owned by Smith; thence with property formerly of Smith and Earle, N. 80-35 W. 94.8 feet to the beginning corner. Subject however, to the terms of and together with all interest in the right of way or easement which goes with said lot as set forth in deed from T. E. Gibson to Annie H. Smith dated October 20, 1921, and recorded in Deed Book 73, page 288, R. M. C. office for Greenville County. This right of way is a joint driveway 8 feet in width, and the Northern line of said driveway at all times runs 150 feet South of and parallel to West Stone Avenue for a depth of 96 feet.

The above is the same conveyed me by Clint J. Mitchell by her deed dated September 16, 1942, to be recorded, and this mortgage is given in order to obtain a portion of the purchase price to pay for said property.
