All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Butler Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, about 11 miles from the City of Greenville on the West side of the road from Simpsonville to Batesville (referred to in previous deeds as the Old Augusta Road), being composed of four separate parcels of land which adjoin each other and constitute one tract, containing forty-eight (48) acres, more or less. Three of said tracts of land have collectively the following lines, metes and bounds, towit:

BEGINNING at a stake on the west side of the Old Augusta Road, and running thence along the line of the one and a quarter (1½) acre tract next hereinafter referred to S. 40 degrees W. 6.38 chains to a post-oak; thence N. 55½ degrees W. 11.54 chains to a stake; thence N. 57 degrees W. 3.34 chains to a stake; thence N. 1½ degrees W. 21.00 chains to a stake; thence N. 24 degrees E. 4.15 chains to a stone on road leading to the old John Henderson Home; thence S. 72½ degrees E. 15.33 chains to a stone on the Old Augusta Road; thence along said road S. 6½ degrees E. 3.40 chains to a stone on said road; thence S. 3 degrees W. 11.25 chains to a bend in said road; thence along said road S. 7 degrees W. 9.44 chains to the beginning corner, containing forty-six and three-fourths (46 3/4) acres, more or less.
