in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me in hand well and truly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Bank of Piedmont, its successors and assigns forever;

All that lot of land in Greenville County, State of South Carolina in Greenville Township being known and designated as the Northeaster portion of lot 17, on plat recorded in Plat Book L at Page 177, and described as follows:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Southern side of Summitt Avenue, at the center of the front line of lot 17 (the corner of the lot heretofore sold to Manning B.
