WHEREAS, W.T. Henderson, George W. Buchanan and L.G. Scott, all of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 7th day of Feby. 1908 file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

First: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be as above given.
Second: The name of the proposed corporation be that of BUCHANAN, HENDERSON, SCOTT COMPANY

Third: The principal place of business of the corporation will be Greenville, S.C.

Fourth: The general purpose of the corporation, and the nature of business it proposes to do.
(a) to do a general mercantile business, to make contracts, to loan money to acquire, receive, hold and enjoy property, both real and personal, and transfer and alien the same, possessing the same power in these respects as individuals now enjoy,
(b) to sue and be sued by its corporate name;
(c) to have a common seal and alter the same at pleasure,

One hundred of the par value of one hundred dollars each.

Sixth: The capital stock to be payable as set forth in the Declaration and Petition.
