Heirs and Assigns, against itself and its successors in office and against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.

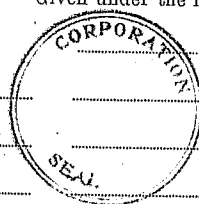

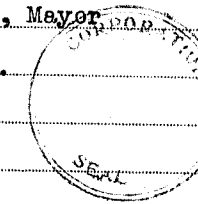
