KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That

I, W. S. M. Maxwell

in the State aforesaid

in consideration of the sum of

P.C. Poag and J.J. McSwain

(the receipt whereof

is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release, unto the said

P.C. Poag and J.J. McSwain, share and share alike, all the one-half interest
 in the estate of the late Henry Mosley of Greenville County, State of South
 Carolina, undisposed of by order of the Court, and being the same
 one-half interest desired by my wife, Rachel Mosley Maxwell, under
 and by virtue of the will of her father, the said Henry Mosley, deceased,
 and by the said Rachel Mosley Maxwell duly conveyed by her deed on
 March 16, 1914 to Wade H. Powell; said deed being left for record in
 P.M.C. office in said County and State, and conveyed thereafter on the
 said March 16, 1914 to me by the said Wade H. Powell, who was and is
 an unmarried man. Said deed being left in P.M.C. office aforesaid
 to be recorded. Said deeds of conveyance being intended to convey all the one-
 half interest of the said Rachel Mosley Maxwell in said estate, and in-
 cluding her one-half interest as a vested remainderman in the five
 houses and lots in which her mother, Mary Mosley, has a life estate,
 but said deed and this deed are not intended to convey any interest or
 estate belonging to any other person, to wit; Mrs. A. C. Davis situate
 within the general bounds and limits set forth in this deed
 and the property hereby conveyed includes the said five houses and lots
 within the general area and has the following metes and bounds:
 Beginning at a point on Washington Street extension fifty feet south-
 east of the original corner of the Mosley property, backrunning
 thence along Washington Street 5.38 & 3.88.7 feet to an iron pipe on pro-
 perty belonging to the Southern Railway Company, and thence along
 said Southern Railway Company's line N. 58-58.256.5 feet to an iron pipe
 thence along the right of way of the Southern Railway Company N. 11-52 & 80.08
 feet to Elizabeth Street which is 30 feet wide; and thence from the North side
 of Elizabeth Street on said Southern Railway Company right-of-way N. 11-
 52 E. 55-9.8 feet more or less to an iron pipe on property belonging to the
 Standard Oil Company, thence along the line of the Standard Oil Company
 N. 81-47-72 + 4 feet; thence S. 20-32 W. 349 feet to an iron pipe on Elizabeth
 Street; thence across Elizabeth Street and from a point on the South
 side of said Elizabeth Street at the Northeast corner of lot No. 14 recently
 sold by order of the Court; and thence along the East line of lot No. 14 S.
 56-35 W. 125 feet to the corner of lot No. 14, thence N. 46-38.650 feet to the
 Southwest corner of lot No. 10 and thence along the East line of a lot for-
 merly conveyed by John L. Bramlett, Judge of Probate, by deed described
 in P.M.C. Office in Vol. A. T. K. page 224, to the beginning point on the
 Washington Street extension, and also lots No. 6 and No. 8 as shown by
 a plat of said estate recorded in P.M.C. office, Plat Book A. pages
 358-359.
