at and before the sealing of these presents by W. H. Brown, T. B. Bramlett, H. G. Copeland and T. O. Ballenger, Deacons of the Fairview Baptist Church,

(the receipt whereof

is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release, unto the said W.H. Brown, T.B. Bramlett, H.G. Copeland and T.O. Ballenger, deacons of the Fairview Baptist Church, All that certain piece, parcel and lot of land situate, lying and being in the State and County aforesaid, adjoining lands of R.B. Vaughan and being the same lot of land conveyed to the Trustees of the Fairview School by the deacons of the Fairview Baptist Church by deed bearing date of Oct. 4th, 1910, and recorded in the office of the R.M.C. for Greenville County in Vol. 9, at page 9, and having the following metes and bounds:

Beginning on a red oak stump; thence N. 26-1/4 E. 1.83 chs. to a stone; thence N. 34-7/8 W. 3.72 chs. to a stone; thence S. 55-7/8 W. 1.50 chs. to a pine; thence S. 34-7/8 E. 4.63 chs. to the beginning corner, containing sixty-four one hundredths of an acre, more or less.

Also all that other piece, parcel and lot of land situate, lying and being in the State and County aforesaid, adjoining lands of R.B. Vaughan and the Fairview Baptist Church, and being the same lot of land conveyed to the Trustees of the Fairview School by R.B. Vaughan by deed bearing date of Oct. 4th, 1910, and recorded in the office of the R.M.C. for Greenville County in Vol. 6, at page 273, and having the following metes and bounds:

Beginning at a red oak stump, church corner; thence S. 83-1/4 W. 69 links to a stone; thence N. 34-7/8 W. 4.50 chs. to a stone; thence N. 74 E. 61 links to a pine; thence S. 34-7/8 E. 4.63 chs. to the beginning corner, containing one-fourth of an acre, more or less.
