HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release unto the said J. A. Waldrop, J. R. Waldrop, H. V. Waldrop and S. V. Waldrop all the right, title and interest of Mrs. Hattie Belle Sudduth, Mrs. Minnie Bridges, Mrs. Bettie Robinson, Henry Springfield, Furman Springfield, Goodlett Springfield, Mary Springfield, Annie H. Tinsley, Ollie B. Springfield, and Ford Springfield in and to, all that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Saluda Township, County and State aforesaid, containing ninety-nine and 64/100 (99.64) acres, more or less, adjoining lands of Luther Cox and others, and being that portion of the real estate of Susan Cox, deceased, designated in the partition thereof as tract No. 1 and purchased at the sale of said real estate by J. A. Waldrop, J. R. Waldrop, H. V. Waldrop and S. V. Waldrop, and conveyed to them by J. W. Gray, Master of Greenville County, which said deed is referred to for a more specific description of said land.

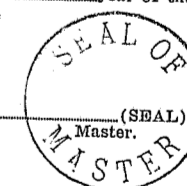
