TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

I, E. Inman  
Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETING:

WHEREAS, Oscar Hodges

on or about the 2nd day of January in the year of  
our Lord nineteen hundred and seven exhibited his complaint in the Court of  
Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against Sylvia Sloan, et al

demanding judgment in relation to the real estate hereinafter  
mentioned and described; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 16th  
day of February 1917, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

of the said Court,  
whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate  
hereinafter mentioned and described be sold by E. Inman Master in and for the County aforesaid, of the terms and for  
the purposes mentioned in the said Decree  
as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear; and the Master, after having duly advertised the said real estate

for sale by public outcry on the 5th day of March in the year of our Lord  
nineteen hundred and seventeen did then openly and publicly, according to the custom of auction, sell and dispose  
of the same unto Oscar Hodges

for the sum of One Hundred Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars,  
being at that price the highest bidder therefor.

NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, that I, E. Inman  
Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One Hundred Fifty  
(\$150.00) Dollars,  
to me paid by the said Oscar Hodges

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto  
the said Oscar Hodges, the following described real estate, to wit:

" All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate,  
lying and being outside the incorporate limits of the  
City of Greenville, County and State aforesaid, on Richland  
Creek and Mt Zion Avenue, and being designated as Lot  
No. 15 as shown on a plat made by Slope, and re-  
corded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in  
Plat Book C, at page 99, and having the following  
metes and bounds: Beginning at the iron pin on Mt.  
Zion Avenue, corner of lot No. 16, and running thence  
with said Avenue N. 1/2 E. 48 feet to corner of lot No. 14  
thence with a well line of lot No. 14 N. 55 1/2 W. 108 feet to  
corner on Richland Creek; thence S. 25 7/8 W. 71 feet to  
corner of lot No. 16; a fence with the line of lot No. 16  
S. 62 E. 170 feet to the beginning corner, and being the  
same tract of land conveyed to Oliver Sloan by  
Florence W. Schockley by her deed dated February  
18th, 1914. "

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or  
appertaining; and all the estate, right, title, claim and interest whatsoever, of the parties to the cause aforesaid, and of each of them in and to the same;  
and of all other persons rightfully claiming from, under, or by these or any of them.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the premises before mentioned, unto the said Oscar Hodges, his

heirs and assigns forever.
