TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the premises beforementioned, unto the said

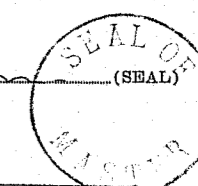
H. P. Mc Kee, his
