Twenty-one hundred seventy-seven & 50/100 (\$2,177.50) DOLLARS,  
to me .....in hand paid  
at and before the sealing of these presents by J. L. Burnett

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, sell and Release unto the said

J. L. Burnett; all that certain piece and lot  
of land, situate, lying and being in the State  
and County aforesaid, in Oneal Township, on waters  
of Frohawk Creek beginning at an iron pin on the  
South side of Frohawk Creek near a large white oak  
3 m. and running N. 68-45' W. 8.32 chains up said  
creek to an iron pin near the south edge of  
said stream; thence N. 10-40 W. 19.94 chains to an iron  
pin; thence due east 8.28 chains to an iron pin;  
thence S. 10-40 E. 17.79 to an iron pin; thence due West  
11 links to an iron pin; thence S. 0-45-W. 5.10 chains  
to beginning, containing seventeen & 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ /100 (17.42) acres more  
or less according to plat and survey made by  
W. A. Christopher, Oct. 31, 1919, and known as lot No. 1
