Upon the full performance of the conditions and obligations of said notes and mortgages, this assignment shall be void and of no effect and thereupon in that event said New York Life Insurance Company will re-assign to said O.O. Hobbs all of its interest, right and title in and to said lease now acquired under and by virtue of this assignment.
