

Whereas, heretofore in 1917 Dally Dickson, Bolling Dickson, Mary Dickson Walker and Nola Dickson Whitney, the complainants filed their Bill of Complaint in the U.S. District Court of the Western District of South Carolina against J. A. Davenport and others, and on or about April 15, 1919, filed their amended bill of complaint against J. A. Davenport, et al, including as defendant the grantee herein named; and whereas, the cause proceeded to final judgment, duly affirmed in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit, adjudicating that the Complainants were entitled to 76/240 undivided interest, and the within grantor 64/240 undivided interest in the real estate herein below described; and, whereas, this grantor has disposed of his interest to B. F. Martin and C. M. Blythe in the said real estate;

Blythe, their heirs and assigns; all of my said 64/240 interest in the following tract of land: Seventy-three and one-third per cent. of the ten acre tract deeded to J. M. Davenport by G. E. Chapman by deed recorded in Book 21, page 463, and appearing on recent plat of G. E. Dalton as the J. M. Davenport tract of ten acres, more or less, recorded in office of R. M. C. in Plat Book 6 page 192 (R. M. C. will here insert); part of the tract herein conveyed is a rectangle lying next to the G. E. Chapman tract on said plat, with side lines of 15.80 chains and front and back lines of seventy-three and one-third per cent. of the front line and back line appearing in said deed from Chapman to Davenport and in the said Dalton plat.

And being the remaining portion of said ten acres after taking off the tract described in deed of the date from the said B. F. Martin and C. M. Blythe to the said J. M. Davenport.

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
