I, Crosser Goldsmith

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of five dollars and the foregoing
per acre
to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Manly Goldsmith,
Thomas Goldsmith and Treasure Bivings

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the
said grantee(s) above named to-wit: Manly Goldsmith, Thomas
Goldsmit and Treasure Bivings, their successors, heirs and
assigns, all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Austin
Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, about
four miles east of Simpsonville and known as a part
of the Lewis lands. Beginning at a stone on Henry Goldsmith
line and runs thence N. 14 W. 17.20 to stake near the
big road; thence N. 12 1/2 E. 26.85 to a poplar stump on
side of branch, thence down the branch to a stake
at the intersection of Horsepen and Gilders Creek;
thence up said Horsepen Creek to a stone near a plantation
road crossing; thence S. 19 E. 32.25, thence S. 30 E. 16.37
to a stone in side of public road; thence S. 66 E. 13.33
to the beginning containing 115 1/2 acres more or less.

As a part of the consideration for this conveyance
the grantee do hereby assume and will pay, according
to its terms, the balance due on the mortgage by
me to said Hunt and Todd said mortgage dated
Nov. 25 1919 and recorded in Vol. 79 page 242, originally
given for \$1859.13.

TOGETHER with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or
pertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular, the said premises before mentioned, unto the said Manly Goldsmith,
Thomas Goldsmith and Treasure Bivings, their
heirs and assigns, forever.

In trust, Nevertheless, to hold the legal title for all the parties
named, to divide said land among them as may be agreed by them
and make good and sufficient deeds therefor, to, as their
discretion and upon such terms as to them shall seem proper, sell and
convey the interest of William Goldsmith, if he should request it before he
reaches the age of twenty-one years, and to him or such other person as he may
direct after he reaches the age of twenty-one years, or may sell and convey the
whole land upon written request of all of said parties.

AND do hereby bind

heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend, all and singular, the said premises unto the said grantee(s), their
successors.
