In witness whereof, the said Conestee Mills has caused these presents to be signed in its name and behalf by its President, its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed, and to be attested by its Secretary, this the 30 day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and in the one hundred and fifty-first year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States of America.
