To the Honorable H.H. Watkins, United States District Judge: The Trustee in the above matter has filed his petition asking the confirmation of the sale of real estate and certain other properties described in his petition to E.A. Gilfillin, for the sum of \$15,000. Also for the confirmation of the sale of certain notes and accounts receivable to Lula R. Smith for the sum of \$1.00.

As shown by the appraisement, a copy of which is hereto attached, the real property and other property for which a bid of \$15,000 is received, was appraised at \$59,000. This appraisal at \$59,000, according to the appraisers' report, includes the real estate, easements, fire equipment, and all other properties sold to E.A. Gilfillin. It appears, therefore, that the bid aggregates practically twenty-three per cent of the appraisal. At a meeting of creditors September 1st, 1926, duly and legally held, the said creditors authorized the Trustee to accept the bid of E.A. Gilfillin and recommended the confirmation of the sale by the Court.

It is my opinion that it would be for the best interest of the estate to accept the bid of E.A. Gilfillin, as made, that no more could be realized by a sale of the property in parcels, and that no more can be realized by resale.

The Trustee also in his petition asks confirmation of the sale of certain notes and appounts receivable in the sum of \$3642.13, to Lula R. Smith for the sum of One Dollar. In my epinion these accounts are practically worthless and I think it would be for the best interest of Mareditors that this sale be confirmed. The oreditors recommend the acceptance of this bid and the confirmation of the sale.

Wherefore, I recommend that the Court confirm the sale of the real estate and certain other properties described in the petition, with the exception of certain notes and accounts receivable, and that the Trustee be directed and authorised upon the payment of \$15,000 by E.A. Gilfillin to execute and deliver unto the said E.A. Gilfillin a deed in fee simple, conveying all right, title and interest of the said bankrupt estate in the said properties. I further resommend that the taxes and insurance for the year 1986 be apportioned as of September 1, 1928.

I further recommend that the sale of the notes and accounts receivable to Lula R. Smith be confirmed and that the Trustee be authorized and empowered to convey and deliver unte the said Lula R. Smith the said notes and accounts receivable, upon his payment to the Trustee of the sum of One Dellar.
