Gafford; All those

certain pieces, parcels or lots of land situate, lying and being on the Old Spartanburg Road in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, being known and designated as Lots Nos. 1, 2, and 3, as shown on plat of the Estate of Dr. J.A. White, said plat being recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book "A" pages 161, 162, and having, according to said

plat, the following names and bounds, to wit:
Beginning in the center of said Old Spartanburg Road, and running thence with said Road N. 56-07 E. 450.25 feet to corner of lot No. 4; thence with line of lot No. 4, N. 51-40 W. 461.8 feet to corner on a twenty-foot road; thence with line of said road S. 66-48 W. 198.4 feet to corner; thence S. 6-26 W. 230.6 feet to iron pipe, corner of lot No. 1; thence with line of lot No. 1, S. 15-57 E. 339.2 feet to the beginning corner. Containing in the aggregate 3.86 acres, more or less. On this property is situate dwelling house, barn, servants' house and chicken houses. This is a part of the land conveyed to Dr. J.A. White by W.W. Burgess, by deed dated October 10th, 1905, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Vol. R.R.R. page 92.

It is understood and agreed that the twenty-foot road hereinabove referred to is to forever remain open for the joint use and benefit of all the abutting property owners thereon, and that the same shall never be closed without the consent of all of them. This deed is made in pursuance of the authority contained in the Will of Dr. J.A. White, which was admitted to common form by the Judge of the Court of Probate for Greenville County, S.C., and is now on file in said office, reference to which is hereby made.

And the said granting corporation does hereby bind itself and its successors to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises to the grantee hereinabove named, and his heirs and assigns, against itself and its successors, and against every person whatsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, in witness whereof, the said granting corporation has caused its corporate seal to be hereunto affixed and these presents to be witnessed by its officers L. D. Beattie, President and H. J. Maynor, Cashier, on this the 31st day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five.
