Know all men By These Presents, That The Salvation Army, a religious and charitable corporation incorporated under and by virtue of the laws of the State of New York, having its principal office at 122 West 14th Street, New York City, in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One (\$1.00) Dollars to it in hand paid at and before the sealing of these Presents, by The Salvation Army, a religious and charitable corporation incorporated under the Laws of the State of Georgia having its principal office in the City of Atlanta, in the State aforesaid, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents does grant, bargain, sell and release, unto the said The Salvation Army, the Grantee herein,

All that certain piece, parcel and lot of land, situate, lying and being in the City and County of Greenville in the State of South Carolina, on the South side of Broad Street, East of Main, and having the following lines, meters and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning on an iron pin on the South side of Broad Street in the Northeast corner of Lot no. 4 on a plat hereinafter referred to, and running thence, with the line of said lot no. 4 South 20 West 110 feet to an iron pin; thence South 70 East 50 feet to an iron pin; thence North 20 East 110 feet to Broad Street; thence, with said Broad Street North 70 West 50 feet to the beginning corner, and being a part of the original Jail lot known as Lots nos. 2 and 3 on a Plat made by J. N. Southern, D. S. on the 21st day of May, 1891, recorded in the office of the Register of Meigs Conveyance for Greenville, South Carolina, Vol. 70. 24. Page 561.

About nine feet of the rear of these lots are included in an alleyway and are sold subject to such rights as the Public may have acquired therein.

Together, with all and singular the Rights, Men, Hereditaments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

To Have And to Hold, all and singular the said

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premises before mentioned unto the said The Salvation Army, the grantee herein, its successors and assigns forever.

This conveyance is made pursuant to an Order of the Supreme Court held in and for the County of New York, bearing date the 23rd. day of May, 1927, in a proceeding therein entitled "In The Matter of the Application of The Salvation Army for Leave to Convey its Real Property Located in the City of Greenville, County of Greenville and State of South Carolina."

And the said The Salvation Army, the grantor herein, its successors + assigns do hereby bind itself and its successors and assigns to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said The Salvation Army, the grantee herein, its successors and assigns, against itself and its successors and assigns lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
