All my undivided right, title and interest in and to  
all that part of that lot, with the building thereon situated  
as lies north of a line drawn exactly through the center of  
all that certain lot of land situated on the East side of  
North Main St., between Coffee and North Streets, in the  
City and County of Greenville, South Carolina, fronting said  
Main St. 51 feet, more or less, and extending back 105 feet  
and 6 inches, the building being 120 feet long 6 inches  
and a strip of land at the rear 10 feet wide to be used  
in common with the owners of that portion abutting  
Main St., and by those owning that abutting Brown St.

The following terms, conditions and stipulations were  
contained in the Deed of the Court in the above entitled  
action and herein incorporated in and are to become a  
part of this conveyance, to wit:

That the brick wall herein above referred to as not  
being situated in the center of said lot, shall at the request  
of the owner of either side of said center line "whichever,  
the same may be, to be built so that its center shall be  
directly on the center line above referred to, and one-half  
of the cost thereof shall be paid by the respective owners  
of the property lying North and South respectively of said  
center line, said wall to be built to the depth said building  
now measures, that the stairway and upstairs hall way as now  
constructed and such shall, until said center wall is built  
remain as they are now for the joint use of the owners of the lot  
after the division above provided for, and their upkeep and main-  
tenance shall be equally borne by them."

October 1904. Also, all that piece parcel or lot of land on Waters of Reedy River  
containing 10 1/4 acres, this being the same tract conveyed to Arch. Gammon  
by David W. Hardy and others by Dr. C. S. Riley, attorney, and recorded by said  
Arch. Gammon to John T. Babble and grant John T. Babble to T. P. Babble  
County, State of South Carolina, recorded in Book D D D page 465. The last three tracts  
above described contain a total acreage of 27.2 acres, more  
or less, and being known as the Tully P. Babble home place.
