Dear Mr. Moore:

Following our conversation of yesterday I beg leave to say:

While we may not cover as much ground as we did in 1928, and may make the building one story instead of two, there are good reasons for changing our present plan. In order to be on the safe side we will pay you three hundred dollars rental with the understanding that we shall be at liberty to cover the same amount of your ground adjoining Textile Hall with our temporary building as we did in 1928, and two stories high if we desire.

You have stated that if we will pay you three hundred dollars you will allow us to begin work a month earlier than stated in my letter of a few days ago, and this is therefore understood as one of the conditions.

The three hundred dollars above referred to is to be paid two hundred dollars next month and one hundred dollars when we begin work, or not later than September 1st, 1930.

I enclose copy of this letter and a stamped addressed envelope. If the proposition is agreeable please sign and return.
