All that right, title and interest of the Defendants, Ruth Harbin, Maggie Mae Harbin, Charlie Harbin, Marie Harbin and Doris Harbin, in and to the following described real estate:

"All that certain tract of land situated in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, lying south of the City of Greenville, and on the left hand side of the Augusta Road leading from Greenville, containing 12 acres, more or less, including one acre referred to in deed to J. H. Harbin from G. C. Richardson which deed is recorded in the R. M. C, Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 56 page 363, and the balance being all of a 60 acre tract of land conveyed to J. H. Harbin by S. J. Douthit, Master by deed recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book QQ, page 487, and being bounded by the Augusta Road, lands now or formerly of Myer and Hicks.
