All of our right, title and interest in and to the following described real estate to-wit: All that piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina known as Lot no. 88 of a tract of land known as the Colonial Company, and having the following metes and bounds to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin at the corner of Lot no. 87 and Lot no. 88 on Douny Brook Avenue, thence N 46-50 E 67 feet to an iron pin; thence N 44-02 W 200 feet to an iron pin; thence S 46-50 W 67 feet to an iron pin; thence S 44-02 E 200 feet to an iron pin at beginning corner. Being the same lot of land conveyed to U. E. Pace by the Colonial Company by deed dated September 20, 1923, and recorded in the R. M. L. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 72, page 385.
