WHEREAS, J. B. Hall, P. R. Long and Ralph Cox,  
all of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 5th day of January, 1932, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Hall Bros. & Co.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is a general real estate, rental, brokerage, insurance and collection business, and to make loans, to sell or to purchase or discount bonds, bills, notes or other papers, and to do all things permitted or authorized by law incident or necessary to the conduct and operation of said business, with all of the general powers conferred upon business corporations under the general laws of the State of South Carolina.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00)

payable in cash or securities or properties acceptable to and on the call of the Board of Directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is One hundred and fifty (150) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 1st day of January, 1932, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

J. B. Hall, P. R. Long and Ralph Cox

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President J. B. Hall as Vice-President, P. R. Long; as Secretary, Ralph Cox as Treasurer, J. B. Hall

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter L, Article L, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
