being my homeplace and consisting of two tracts bought by me from T. M. Griffin and more fully described in his deed to me, recorded in the office of R. M. C., County and State aforesaid, in Deed Book 41, at page 393, and also being more fully described in feed to said T. M. Griffin by Fred Cox, dated on or about March 12th, 1915, recorded in said office in Deed Book 18, page 469, and in a plat, or plats, by J. P. Willis on or about August21st, 1907, said deeds and plat being here in-corporated for full description; this deed being made to cover the entire fifty-seven (57) acres, more or less, in order that it may operate as a confirmation of conveyance heretofore made by me, T. F. Trammell, of one acre, more or less, and given him good fee simple title of all of both tracts herein referred to.

The metes and bounds of these two tracts are as follows:

- (1) The smaller tract, beginning at a stone on the creek and running up the creek N.  $34\frac{1}{2}$  W. to a stone on the creek, thence N.  $87\frac{1}{4}$  W. 34.50; thence S.  $14\frac{1}{2}$  E. 7.53; thence S. 87 E. 30.60 to the beginning corner.
