WHEREAS, J. A. Johnson and Mabel Lee Johnson,
both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 27th day of November, 1935, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is New Day Cleaners, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is General cleaning, dry-cleaning, dyeing, laundering and pressing business of any and all kinds and types.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Five Thousand (\$5,000.00)
and 10,000 shares without par value Dollars,
payable Twenty (20%) per cent cash, and balance at call of Directors

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is One thousand (1,000)
Preferred Stock Five (\$5.00) Dollars
of the par value and 10,000 shares of common stock without par value

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 18th day of November, 1935, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:

J. A. Johnson and Mabel Lee Johnson

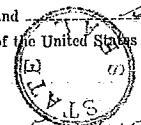
EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President J. A. Johnson
as Vice-President, Mabel Lee Johnson; as Secretary, Mabel Lee Johnson
as Treasurer, J. A. Johnson

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
