WHEREAS, American Building and Loan Association,

on or about the 19th day of March in the year of

NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That J. E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of
Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars
to me paid by the said American Building and Loan Association,

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said
American Building and Loan Association.

"All those two certain pieces, parcels or lots of land adjoining each other, situate, lying and being on and near Calhoun Street in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, in the City of Greenville, and together having the following metes and bounds, according to a subdivision of land made for The Greenville Trust Company, a plat of same being recorded in Plat Book "C" Page 13, to-wit:
