(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

James C. Putman, his heirs and assigns,

All my right, title, and interest (the same being a one-half undivided interest) in and to the following described real estate;

All of that certain piece, parcel and tract of land situate, lying and being in Greenville County and State aforesaid, in Butler Township, near Roper's Mountain, on waters of Rocky Creek, waters of Shoree River, adjoining lands of S. L. Vaughan, Wm. Greer, Perry Hudson and others, and having the following metes and bounds:

Beginning at a stone on road and thence N. 13 E. 7.45 chains to stone 3x; thence S. 85 1/2 E. 24.21 to stone 3x; thence N. 15 1/2 E. 20.95 to corner in branch; thence down the meanders of said branch as a line 8.90 to stake at the intersection of another branch; thence S. 15 1/2 W. 8.30 to a wild cherry 3x; thence N. 80 1/2 E. 13.12 to stone 3x; thence S. 15 1/2 W. 36.00 to stone 3x; thence N. 73 1/2 W. 43.10 to the beginning containing eighty-nine and 75/100 acres, more or less, as surveyed by W. A. Adams, Jan. 28, 1914.

The above described property is the same property conveyed by A. J. Mahaffey to J.F. Watson by deed recorded in R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Vol. 28 at page 317, the said J. F. Watson having died testate April 27, 1925, and the will of the said J. F. Watson being of record in the office of the Judge of Probate for Greenville County in Apt. 197, Folio 24.

Being the same property that Maude Watson Swicegoal conveyed her one-fourth undivided interest in to the grantor herein by deed dated April 4, 1930, recorded in R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 133, at page 404. it being the intention of the grantor to convey her entire interest in said property to the grantees herein.
