 All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville township, Greenville
 County, State of South Carolina about two miles north of the Courthouse on the east side of
 the Buncombe Road and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on said road at the corner of lot owned by A. B. Neely and
 running thence along the line of the Neely lot S. 84 $\frac{1}{2}$ S. 171 feet and 2 inches, more or less
 to corner of Bayne's lot; thence along the line of said Bayne lot N. 6-15 W. 45 feet to a
 point in line of lot of John Hunt; thence along the line of said John Hunt's lot about S.
 50 W. 183 feet, more or less, to point on the Buncombe Road; thence along said Buncombe
