the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto

"All that lot, parcel or piece of land, lying and being in the town of
Taylor's in Chick Springs Township, State and County aforesaid, and being about 200 yards
south of Barrowbone Creek on the Edwards Road, and adjoining lands of Carrie Greenleaf
and other lands of Steve Johnson and having the following metes and bounds:
