Charter

BY the Secretary of State

Whereas, L. M. Coury and Grace D. Coury, both of

Greenville, S. C., did on the 7th day of October, 1936, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

- First: That their names and residences are as above given.
- Second: That the name of the proposed corporation is Coury's Cut Rate Fruit Store.
- Third: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.
- Fourth: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is General merchandise, fruits and produce.
- Fifth: That the amount of the capital stock is twenty-five Hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars, payable paid up.

Sixth: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is twenty-five (25) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

Seventh: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 8th day of October, 1936, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

L. M. Coury and Grace D. Coury.

Eighth: That subsequently there was elected as president, L. M. Coury; Vice President, Grace D. Coury; as Secretary, Grace D. Coury; as Treasurer, L. M. Coury.

Ninth: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

Now, Therefore, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority invested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said County has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds, Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

Given under my hand and the seal of my State, at Columbia, this 7th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty six and is the one hundred and sixty-first year of the Independence of the United States of America.
