WHEREAS, Charles F. True and A. E. Duvall, both of  
Greenville, S.C.

did on the 4th day of October, 1936, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
- SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Carolina Sea Food Company, Inc.
- THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy, sell and generally deal in fish and sea products, poultry and poultry products, produce and food products of every kind and descriptions, acquire, lease, maintain and operate cold storage and refrigeration plants and to do any and all things necessary in carrying on a wholesale or retail fish, poultry or produce business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Five thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars,  
payable in cash or its equivalent.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is fifty (50)  
of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 31st day of October, 1936, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:  
Charles F. True and A. E. Duvall.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Charles F. True  
as Vice-President, A. E. Duvall; as Secretary, Charles F. True  
as Treasurer, A. E. Duvall

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville Piedmont  
a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
