WHEREAS, H. B. Jackson, Anderson, S.C., and R. B. Earle, A. J. D. Starr, S.C.

did on the 21st day of December, 1937, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is The Combination Store of Greenville S.C.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Anderson, S.C. Office Greenville, S.C. Store

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is retail general merchandise - own, control and lease real estate, and buy, mortgage or sell the same to own, buy, or sell personal property of all kinds, execute any and all contracts, bonds and other indentures found necessary, desirable or convenient to engage in any business enterprise.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Eighteen Hundred (\$1,800.00) Dollars,
payable in cash

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred and eighty (180) of the par value of ten (\$10.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 16th day of December, 1937, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors:
D. Carroll Brown, W. D. Brown, H. B. Jackson, E. B. King, R. B. Earle and C. J. Brown

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President D. Carroll Brown as Vice-President, W. D. Brown; as Secretary, H. B. Jackson as Treasurer, D. Carroll Brown

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

a newspaper published in the County of Anderson The Daily Mail

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
