All that tract or lot of land in Cleveland Township, Greenville County, State South Carolina, having the following metes and bounds: Beginning on a Red Oak and runs thence S. 62 W. 6.50 cns. to a stone; thence S. 23 1/2 W. 6.94 cns. to a stone; thence S. 27 E. 20.75 cns. to a stone; thence N. 58 1/2 E. 8.75 cns. to a stone; thence S. 54 1/2 E. 2.00 cns. to a poplar; thence N. 44 1/2 E. 34.00 cns. to a black oak down; thence N. 62 1/2 E. 7.50 cns. to a post oak stump; thence N. 88 1/2 W. 39.30 cns. to a stake; thence S. 3 W. 5.00 cns. to the beginning corner, containing eighty-three (83) acres, more or less, and is the same tract of land conveyed to me by H. R. Dempsey, by deed recorded Volume 185, page 97, R.A.C. Office for Greenville County.

A. G. Perry vs. Complainant Marshall County Alabama
Rose Perry Respondent. At Guntersville, Alabama.

This cause coming on to be heard was submitted upon Bill of complaint, Decree Pro Confesso taken on March 26, 1928, and and testimony as noted by the Register, and upon consideration whereof, the Court is of the opinion that the Complainant is entitled to the relief prayed for in the bill.

It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court that the bonds of matrimony heretofore existing between the Complainant and Defendant be, and the same are hereby dissolved, and that the said A. G. Perry is forever divorced from the said Rose Perry for and on account of Abandonment.

It is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that neither party to this suit shall again marry except to each other until sixty days after the rendition of this decree, and that if appeal is taken within sixty days, neither party shall again marry except to each other, during the pendency of said appeal.

It is further ordered that A. G. Perry be, and he is hereby permitted to again contract marriage upon payment of the cost of this suit.

It is further ordered that A. G. Perry pay the cost herein to be taxed for which execution may issue.
