One hundred (\$100.00) Dollars,
to me paid by the said J. I. Donble

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the
said J. I. Donble

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land in the City
of Greenville, in the County of Greenville and State of South
Carolina, on the northeast corner of Leach and Southit Streets
having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:
Beginning at a stake on the said corner of said
streets, and running thence in a northerly direction along
Leach Street 105 feet to a stake; thence in an easterly
direction 101 feet, more or less, to the line of the property
of Mrs. I. S. Jackson; thence along her line, in a southerly
direction about 105 feet to a stake on Southit Street,
thence in a westerly direction along Southit Street 100
feet to the beginning corner, be the same more or
less."
