grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said & W. Black and L. E. Black their heira
and assigns:

All that tract of land in 0 Neal Township, Greenville County, containing 55½ acres, more or less, and naving the following metes and bounds, to-wit: Beginning at the A.B. Kemp corner on the M.S. Stokes line, and running thence with this line N. 38½ W. 934 feet to a stone; thence S. 59 1/3 W. 26-15 chains to a stone; S. 80½ W. 11 chains to a stone on the bank of Scuth Tiger River; thence down the meanderings of the river to another corner of the A.B.
