unto the said Bertrude N. Waldrop: All of our undivided one-half interest in and to
all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Butler Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.

and having the following metes and bounds according to a survey recently made by J. Earle Freeman: Beginning at an iron pin in the Pelham Road corner of lands of Perry Hudson now owned by Fred Hudson, and running thence with said Pelham Road, N. 30 1/2 E. 7.90 to a stone or cedar; thence continuing with said road, N. 65 1/8 E. 4.26 to a post oak, gone; thence with old Pelham Road, S. 83- 7/8 E. 8.62 to an iron pin 0m; corner of tract conveyed by Bertrude N. Waldrop to Eva Hudson and Roselle N. Clark; and running thence with line of that tract N. 1-37 W. 23.37 to iron pin on Ward's land, thence with the line of said land, S. 85 1/2 W. 3.00 to a stone; thence S. 17 W. 2.15 to a stone; thence S. 69 W. 15.70 to a chestnut stump to corner of land now owned by Fred Hudson; thence with his line, S. 6 E. 23.52 to the beginning corner, and containing 37 acres, more or less.
