(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said J. W. Smith, E. S. Pepper, and W. B. Freeman, Trustees of Fairview Methodist Protestant Church, its successors or assigns: Forever:

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, lying, situate and being in the State and County aforesaid, in the City of Greenville, located on the North side of Lloyd Street; fronting on Lloyd Street Forty-one (41) feet, and running back One Hundred Twenty-Two (122) feet; on which is located a six room dwelling house, which is known as No. 106.

This is a portion of the property conveyed to R. M. Pickens, Henry Murph and Samuel Wyatt, Trustees of said property for the benefit of Methodist Protestant Church by John Burdine by deed dated May 19, 1870 recorded in the R. M. C.
