

TITLE 17, REAL ESTATE

The objects and purposes specified in the foregoing clauses shall, except where otherwise expressed, be in nowise limited or restricted by reference to, or inference from, the terms of any other clause in this Declaration for Charter, but the objects and purposes specified in each of the foregoing clauses of this article shall be regarded as independent objects and purposes.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Three Hundred Thousand (\$300,000.00) Dollars, and One Hundred Shares (100) without nominal or par value, payable in money or in labor or property at its par value as to par value stock, or at the consideration fixed, as to shares without par value, when and as required by the Board of Directors.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Three Thousand (3,000) Preferred of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, And one hundred (100) shares of common stock without nominal or par value.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 5th. day of April, 1946, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

Marion Brawley, Jr., J. M. Perry and C. M. Gaffney, Jr.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, Marion Brawley, Jr., as Vice-President C. M. Gaffney, Jr.; as Secretary, J. M. Perry; as Treasurer, C. M. Gaffney, Jr.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
