WHEREAS, Gladys Moon

our Lord nineteen hundred and forty-one exhibited her complaint in the Court of
Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against
Dorothy Frances Moon Grice, et al

demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint: and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 28th
day of October, 19 41, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. INMAN, Master in and for
the County aforesaid, to Mrs. Ida Bertha Moore

for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear; (See Judgement Roll No. E-8918)

NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid
decree, and upon receipt of \$1,000.00

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these Presents, DO GRANT, convey, and release unto the said
Mrs. Ida Bertha Moore

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in Greenville
County, South Carolina and described as follows:

Beginning at a stake on road corner of Tract 2 of the Q. A. Green estate and running
thence N. 18-50 W. 155.8 feet to a stone; thence N. 39-50 W. 156 feet to an iron pin; thence
S. 26-16 W. 632.7 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 63-40 E. 249.4 feet to an iron pin; thence
N. 26-20 E. 459 feet to the beginning corner. Containing 3.22 acres, more or less."

A right-of-way 12 feet wide across the eastern side of the lot hereinabove conveyed is
reserved so as to provide ingress and egress to a 22 acre tract of land of the Bub Moon estate
conveyed to the Master to Ben Loftis, said right-of-way being given for the use of the said
Ben Loftis, his heirs and assigns forever.
