WHEREAS, Rome Thomas Herbert

on or about the 18th day of December in the year of  
our Lord nineteen hundred and forty-one exhibited his complaint in the Court of  
Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against Charles Herbert, et al.

demanding relief as to the real estate described in the complaint: and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 29th  
day of December, 1941, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described, be conveyed by E. INMAN, Master in and for  
the County aforesaid, to Iola Fisher,

for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court, will appear; (See Judgement Roll No. E 8991)

NOW, THEREFORE, Know All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid  
decree, and upon receipt of \$701.00  
HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these Presents, DO GRANT, convey, and release unto the said Iola Fisher

"All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of  
South Carolina, Beginning at an iron pin on the north side of Hammett Street, and running thence  
N. 21½ E. 190 feet to an iron pin on an alley; thence along said alley N. 68½ W. 50 feet to an  
iron pin; thence in a southwesterly direction 190 feet, more or less, to an iron pin on Hammett  
Street; thence along Hammett Street S. 68½ E. 60 feet to the beginning corner.

"The above described lot is a portion of the same conveyed to Arthur C. Taylor by D. J.  
Hammett by deed dated October 10, 1900, recorded in Book III, page 704, and being the same property  
deeded to Addie Taylor by William Ernest Taylor by deed dated August 7, 1929, and recorded in the  
R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 148, page 147, reference to which deed is  
hereby craved as often as may be necessary. This is the same lot devised Addie Taylor by her  
father Arthur C. Taylor, See Apt. 226, File 30 Probate Judge Office and the said Addie Taylor  
subsequently married Rome Thomas Herbert."
