TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME:

I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, SEND GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, H. G. Page, et al,

on or about the 14th day of June in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and forty-one exhibited their complaint in the Court of Common Pleas, for the County aforesaid, against Eula Webb, et al,

demanding judgement in relation to the real estate hereinafter mentioned and described; and the cause being at issue, came on to be heard on the 14th day of November, 1941, and such proceedings were had therein as resulted in a Decree

of the said Court, whereby it was adjudged and decreed that the said real estate hereinafter mentioned and described be sold by E. INMAN, Master in and for the County aforesaid, on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in the said decree, as by reference thereto on file in said Court will appear; and the Master, after having duly advertised the said real estate

NOW, THEREFORE, now All Men by These Presents, That I, E. INMAN, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, to me paid by the said Gilbert W. Jones

the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold, and released, and by these Presents, DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Gilbert W. Jones

"All that certain lot of land situate in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, and known and designated as Lot No. 99, as shown on plat of Norwood Heights, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book A, Page 133, and having according to said plat a frontage of 50 feet on Main Street and running back in parallel lines a distance of 150 feet, being one of the lots conveyed to Nancy Jane Page by Jasper N. Page by deed recorded in Vol. 51, Page 208."
