"All that certain parcel or tract of land on the Scuffletown Road, in Austin Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, containing 18.15 acres, more or less, and composed of two tracts - the larger of which came to E. B. Mahaffey through the will of his father, W. H. Mahaffey, and the smaller by deed from L. A. Fowler. The first mentioned tract is shown as tract No. 1 on a plat recorded in the office of the R. M. C. for Greenville County in Plat Book H at page 233. The second mentioned is described in the L. A. Fowler deed, which is recorded in Deed Book 108 at Page 518.
