WHEREAS, WILLIAM E. BENNS, JR. of Columbia, S. C.,

and

WILLIAM EUGENE GARRISON, of Greenville, S. C.,

did on the 12th day of September, 1946, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is PIEDMONT BROADCASTING COMPANY

THIRD: That the principal place of business is GREENVILLE, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy, lease or otherwise acquire and operate any business or businesses connected with the development, manufacture, operation or sale of electronic devices, or any other devices related to broadcasting, to own and operate a radio broadcasting station, and to own and operate any other businesses not prohibited by law; to procure from Government agencies such permits and franchises as may be necessary for the conduct of the above mentioned businesses. The corporation to have the further right to acquire and hold real estate, machinery, equipment and supplies which may be proper for use in connection with the operating of the businesses referred to above, with the right to borrow money and secure the same by mortgage or any form of security available to the corporation covering and including any portion or all of the assets of the corporation, and with the further right and power to do and perform any other acts or engage in any business operation which may be associated with or incident to any of the matters above mentioned.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty-four Thousand (\$24,000.00) Dollars, payable

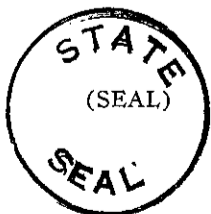
SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is two hundred forty (240) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 4th day of September, 1946, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors: William Eugene Garrison, Cyril G. Brennan and Mrs. Iralee W. Bennis

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Mrs. Iralee W. Bennis as Vice-President, Cyril G. Brennan; as Secretary, Wm. Eugene Garrison as Treasurer, Wm. Eugene Garrison

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent, of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville Piedmont a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
